

Tolent Wins Second Contract at Staythorpe Power Station



Having recently completed a first phase of development at Staythorpe Power Station in Nottinghamshire, Tolent Construction have secured a second contract on the next phase of construction valued at £3.5 million.

Working with PCP Architects and Tim Stower & Partners on behalf of client, Alstom Power, Tolent's first contract at Staythorpe Power Station involved the construction of workshop and stores, administration and control building, gatehouse and oil lube store. The £5 million development was handed over in November 2009 and

Tolent have now commenced on the next phase, a comprehensive external works package for the entire site.

'We were very impressed by Tolent's work on the first phase,' said a spokesman for Alstom Power. 'They were very proactive in their problem solving and responded promptly and amicably to any issues raised.
